Round Robin Showmanship Procedures

Junior and Senior 4-H/FFA members who win a Showmanship class are eligible to compete in Round Robin and Supreme Round Robin Showmanship. Any Junior or Senior 4-H/FFA member who wins more than one Showmanship class must decide which species they wish to show in and notify the Livestock Coordinator immediately after the last showmanship class the exhibitor is participating in.

The Reserve Showman of the species not chosen by the Grand Champion Showman will then be eligible to compete in Round Robin. Two animals from each species will be at each station. There will be a small stock as well as a large stock Round Robin competition. Showmen may compete in either or both competitions.

All showmen who wish to compete for Supreme Round Robin Showmanship must show all species present in small stock and large stock Round Robin. Small stock can include Rabbit, Cavy, and Poultry. Large Stock can include Camelid, Market Swine, Market/Breeding Sheep, Market/Breeding Goat, Dairy/Non-Dairy Goat, Market Beef, Jr. Breeding Cattle, English Horse Showmanship, and Western Horse Showmanship. To qualify for Round Robin, each class must have at least two Showmanship entries per division (Jr. Sr.). Novice Showmanship is NOT included in Round Robin Showmanship.

Junior and Senior large and small stock Round Robin showmanship winners will be determined using a point system. The Junior and Senior Supreme Showman will be selected using a combined score of large stock, small stock species and written knowledge challenge.

- 1. Showmen must show the same animal that was used in the showmanship class in which they won Champion Showman or Reserve Champion Showman.
- 2. Each species will have appointed stations in the show ring. For example; the Junior Showman will have his/her animal at a station and the Senior Showman will have the same species at that station. (Each station may have two animals of the same species.)
- 3. Showmen will have about five minutes at each station and will rotate around the show ring until they have shown each species.
- 4. Each station will have two judges, a Junior Judge and a Senior Judge. Each judge will use a scorecard to judge each Showman.
- 5. There will be a Junior Round Robin Champion and a Senior Round Robin Champion. A Junior and Senior Supreme Round Robin Showman will be selected from the 4-H/FFAShowman who has the most points between small and large stock for their respective age division.

Showmen are not required to show both large and small stock. However, those who choose to compete for Supreme Round Robin Showman will need to compete in both large and small stock.

6. Blank scorecards will be available for review in each livestock barn.

Junior Herdsmen Award Procedures

Each Junior Livestock department offers one Junior Herdsman Award based on the following criteria:

- 1. Neatness, attractiveness and cleanliness of exhibitor's pens and surrounding area.
- 2. Condition and appearance of exhibitor's animals throughout the Fair, and the level of care and attention given to his/her animals.
- Interaction with fairgoers, educational exhibit or presentation in the barn.
- 4. Friendliness and cooperation with staff and fellow exhibitors.
